Don't wait to get tested.

Did you know?

- Chlamydia is the most frequently reported STD in the U.S.
- Both males and females can get chlamydia.
- If you are sexually active, you could have chlamydia and not show any symptoms.
- Untreated chlamydia can lead to long-term health issues, including infertility.

What can you do about it?

 Get screened. It's easy and painless. When caught early, chlamydia can be easily treated with antibiotics.

Worried about privacy? Know your rights!

If you are seeking care for sexual health, your information is confidential if you are age 13 or older...even if you are on your parent's health plan. Here's how it works:

- If you receive a summary of care in the mail the test will be labeled "lab test."
- You may be able to have your follow-up information sent to you in a secure online account. Call the number on the back of your insurance ID card to find out your options.
