- **Q.** What does Stratis Health do?
- A. Stratis Health is celebrating 50 years as an independent nonprofit 501(c)3 organization with a mission to collaborate and innovate to improve health by shifting the focus from volume to value. - **Q.** Why is transforming health care so important?
