

Hypertension in Pregnancy – Your Role as a Support Person

Thursday, March 19, 2026, Noon-1:00 p.m.

Topic: High blood pressure, also known as hypertension, can be especially dangerous for pregnant people. Professionals who work with pregnant people in any capacity – even non-clinical – should be aware of the warning signs, risks to both the mother and the baby, when medical intervention is needed, and how they can provide the support and resources needed. This webinar will introduce the basics of hypertension and what it can lead to in pregnancy. Participants will also receive an overview of resources available to pregnant clients and a basic understanding of when they should contact their medical provider.

For those wanting a deeper understanding of the issue, an additional in-person training for home visitors and other professionals will be held on Monday, March 30. More information will be forthcoming.

Presenter: Dr. Diane Banigo - Dr. Diane Banigo began her academic journey as a pre-med student at the University of Minnesota Duluth before earning her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the College of St. Scholastica in 2001. Called to midwifery, she has practiced as a Certified Nurse-Midwife since 2003 and earned her CNM certification in 2005 after completing her master's degree at the University of Minnesota–Twin Cities. In 2019, she completed her Doctor of Nursing Practice at St. Catherine University, motivated to inspire meaningful, sustainable change.

Dr. Banigo is the author of *All About God's Love*, the owner of Ignited Faces of Beauty, and co-founder of Igniting Power of Woman, where she serves as a social architect and perinatal consultant. She is a full-time midwifery faculty member at Bethel University and maintains a part-time clinical practice in birth center and clinic settings.

In addition to teaching and clinical care, Diane is deeply committed to supporting women beyond childbirth. She partners with families and organizations to nurture vision, purpose, and ministry, guided by divine wisdom in all she does. Who should participate/Audience:


Community Health Workers, Doulas, Home Visitors, Health Educators, Social Workers, and anyone who interacts with pregnant people.

- Identify warning signs and red flags requiring medical follow-up
- Describe risks to the pregnant person and baby
- Determine when medical providers should be contacted
- Recognize the role of non-clinical professionals in support and advocacy
- Identify resources available for pregnant clients
- Apply trauma-informed, culturally responsive communication strategies
