# Upcoming MBQIP Reporting Deadlines

## Required Core Measures Reporting:

- EDTC Q2 2025 due July 31, 2025 (MHA Portal)
- OP-18 Q4 2024 due August 1, 2025 (Hospital Quality Reporting) – **REMINDER - NEW PROCESS**
- HCAHPS Q2 2025 due October 1, 2025 (Hospital Quality Reporting)
- CAH Quality Infrastructure Assessment Survey - Submission window: September 15, 2025- November 21, 2025, via survey link

## Encouraged to Report:

- Hybrid Hospital Wide Readmissions (HHWR) Q3 2024 – Q2 2025 due September 30, 2025 (Hospital Quality Reporting)

## OP-18 New Process for Abstraction

- Starting with Q4 2024 data, abstraction and reporting for OP-18 is integrated into the Hospital Quality Reporting (HQR) portal.
- Instructions and video on how to abstract and submit OP-18 data via HQR are in the [MBQIP Quality Reporting Guide](#), pages 8-9.
- How to Verify Your Data Was Accepted in HQR is on page 9.
- **Important:** You will need a HARP account to submit data into HQR. See pages 6-7.

# Latest MBQIP Reports

## Core Measures Submission

- EDTC Q1 2025 is at 100% reporting (no change in trend). The goal across all MN CAHs is to achieve an overall composite score of greater than 80%.
  - Minnesota Composite Score Performance at 89% for Minnesota
- [EDTC-Measure-Improvement-Ongoing-Lessons-Learned-August-2023.pdf](#)
- OP-18 Q3 2024 is at 92% (70 out of 76 CAHs); Q2 2024 was 95% reporting (72 out of 76 CAHs).
- HCAHPS Q3 2024 is at 96% reporting (73 out of 76 CAHs).

- Three types of reports:
  - MBQIP Report - contains the reporting status and performance on all core measures except HCAHPS
  - HCAHPS – contains HCAHPS composite data elements
  - CAH Quality Infrastructure Implementation Assessment

## Connecting Reporting and Quality

- Make sure to review your quarterly MBQIP reports
- Share with your quality committee
- If seeing a decreasing trend in performance scores, discuss with your committee to identify opportunities for improvement. Consider including it in your QAPI.

## Topic Spotlight: Best Practices for Emergency Department (ED) Patient Flow

## Background

- Stratis Health convened a learning collaborative in early 2025 with 11 Minnesota critical access hospitals, focusing on improving performance on quality measures related to ED care, including median time from arrival to departure (OP-18), patient left without being seen (OP-22), and ED patient experience.

## What does research tell us?

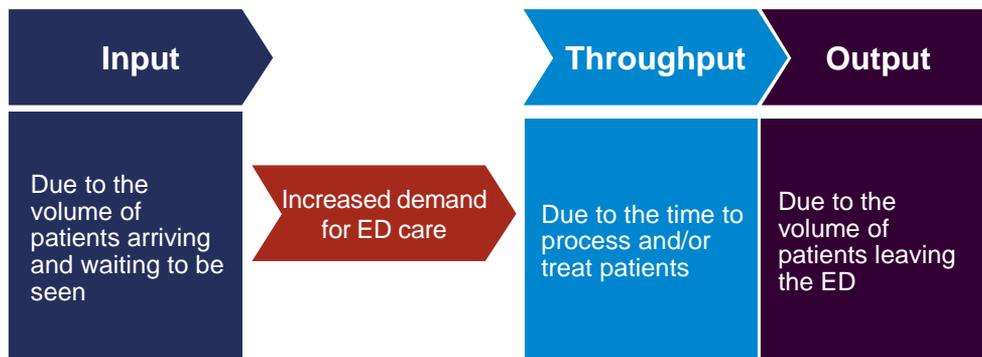
Poor ED patient flow can cause overcrowding, which can lead to:

- An increase in mortality and morbidity
- A decrease in the ability to provide timely care
- Reduction in ED capacity negatively impacts the quality of care
- Patients leaving without being seen
- Decreased job satisfaction
